

THE INTERN

To be eligible, you must be

- A student entering senior year of high school in fall 2022

OR

- An undergraduate college student, continuing-education student, gap-year student, or May 2022 college graduate

AND

- Under age 25 on June 1, 2022
- A member or child of a member in good standing at a Long Island UU congregation

Is the internship only for summer?

SAF interns may participate in the program during the summer and during the 2022–2023 school year.

Must the interns work in person and on Long Island?

The interns may work in person or online, anywhere in the world.

What are SAF interns paid?

SAF pays **\$13/hour** for high school students and **\$15/hour** for college and continuing education students. The awards are **nontaxable** and not subject to Social Security tax.

ABOUT SAF

Student Activity Fund (SAF) is a grant program funded by the Unitarian Universalist Veatch Program at Shelter Rock that enables high school seniors and college students to perform significant service to the community while earning money to help finance their education. The program is sponsored by the Long Island Area Council of UU Congregations (LIAC).

Our Mission

The purpose of SAF is to encourage young Unitarian Universalists to live their religious values through internships in social action, advocacy and service provision.

How It Works

The student finds a non-profit to intern for, and if the organization is approved by the SAF Program Director, SAF pays the intern for up to 35 hours of work per week. There is no cost to the non-profits who hire SAF interns.

THE NON-PROFIT

To receive funding for work done through the SAF student internship program, the intern must choose a non-profit organization whose goals are **one or more of the following:**

- Directly aimed at alleviating inequity, injustice and discrimination
- Encouraging the formulation and implementation of public policies promoting world peace or ecological responsibility
- Designed to preserve and protect civil liberties
- Related to the direct provision of needed services to disadvantaged sectors of society

Students cannot receive SAF award money as a volunteer for a particular political candidate or party campaign, under SAF's guidelines as a religious non-profit program.

THE INTERNSHIP

SAF interns must attend the virtual orientation/leadership workshop on Saturday, May 21. When the intern's non-profit has been approved, it's time to get to work! Here are some internship suggestions:

- Agencies advocating for social justice
- Civil rights organizations
- Soup kitchens & food pantries
- Get Out the Vote initiatives
- Sustainable-living think tanks
- Environmental organizations
- Nutrition and wellness services
- Community gardens or farms
- Community camp programs
- Assisted living, hospice & community clinics
